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Introduction

The department of English was started with the establishment of this college in 1963. Prof. Naresh Mane was first appointed teacher and head of the department of English. Prof. Daniel, his subordinate retired as HOD in 2002 and left the place for Dr. N.A. Mathankar. As Dr. N.A. Mathankar resigned ; Mr. V.M. Khadse continued as the HOD of the department from 2009. Right from the establishment of the college the department has seen its hay days. As English is a compulsory subject for all faculties, the department has ample admissions. English literature was started in 1999 on no grant basis to cater to the need of rural students. To make the rural students competent in English communication, the language laboratory was established in 2013. Presently, the department has three well qualified and experienced faculties.

Facilities

Language laboratory

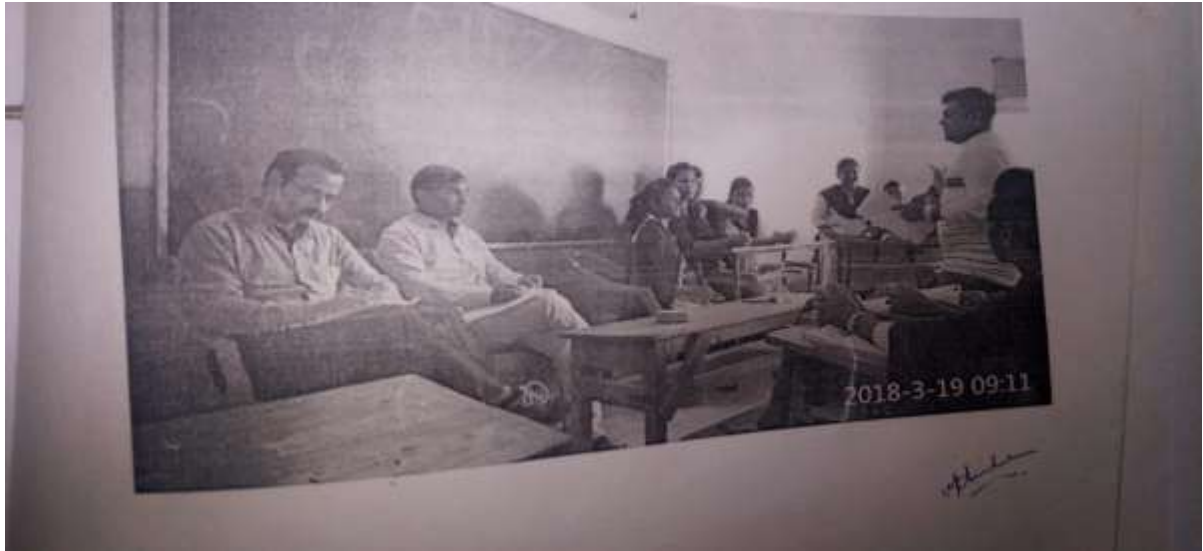
Seminar competition
