Complete Plagiarism



- This is the most obvious case: a Researcher submits, as his or her own work, an essay that has been written by someone else.
- Usually the original source is a published journal article or book chapter.
- The use of unpublished work, *including the work of another Researcher*, is just as serious.
- In such cases, plagiarism *cannot be "avoided" by paraphrasing the original or acknowledging its use in footnotes.*
- The work is the property of another author and should not be used.
